NEPIRC Releases Statewide Manufacturing Report

NEPIRC is pleased to release its <u>Pennsylvania</u> <u>Manufacturing Industry Report 2023</u> – an indepth report on the impact of manufacturing across the Commonwealth. This report objectively presents the most important metrics, trends and measures relative to Pennsylvania's manufacturing economy and uses unbiased data to compare the Commonwealth's industrial economy to other sectors within the state and to those of peer group states across the nation.

Highlights within the report include:

 The near doubling of the Commonwealth's manufacturing output over the past 15 years and rise of PA to be the 6th greatest industrial economy in the nation;



- The consistent growth of manufacturing jobs over the past half-decade, making PA the 6th largest state for manufacturing employment;
- The rise in total annual manufacturing wages across Pennsylvania to nearly \$41 billion last year – making it the Commonwealth's 3rd-largest provider of wealth for Pennsylvanians; and
- The growth in Pennsylvania's manufacturing exports, which now exceed \$43 billion annually, making us the 10th largest exporting state.

NEPIRC published the report as part of its ongoing efforts to support the manufacturing industry, raise awareness of manufacturing careers and keep the manufacturing support programs at the forefront of the minds of legislators and policy makers. "It's sometimes easy to overlook a cornerstone of our economy that has upheld the Commonwealth for decades in favor of things that seem more trendy or glamorous on the surface but generate only a fraction of the benefits and impact," said Eric Joseph Esoda, CPA, NEPIRC President & CEO. "Our intention with this report is to ensure that leaders across Pennsylvania recognize the criticality of our manufacturing industry and the value of the programs and entities that contribute to their enhanced competitiveness, resiliency and success in a global economy," he added.

Pennsylvania Congressional Delegates Announce \$10 Million for Clean Energy Manufacturers

Earlier this month, U.S. Sens. Bob Casey (D-PA) and John Fetterman (D-PA) and U.S. Reps. Chris Deluzio (D-PA) and Summer Lee (D-PA) announced Pittsburgh-based <u>Catalyst</u> <u>Connection</u>, part of PA MEP, would receive \$10 million to support clean energy manufacturing in the region.



Catalyst Connection will provide consulting and training services for small manufacturers in the clean energy and green technology sectors. Additionally, the organization will work with organizations in neighboring states to strengthen the clean energy sector. The funding will support the manufacture of renewable energy, hydrogen power, low-carbon and decarbonized power, smart grid improvements, electric vehicles and green buildings, officials said.

The funding, part of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, was awarded by the Appalachian Regional Commission, and will be used to provide training and supply chain mapping, as well as guidance on factory upgraded to support renewable energy manufacturing, hydrogen power and other green energy alternatives.

Gentex Receives Federal Funding to Modernize Carbondale Plant

Gentex Corporation, which produces protective gear for the military, will use \$5 million in federal funding to continue updating its nearly 130-year-old facility.



Patrick Stallings, senior director of operations at Gentex Corp.'s headquarters in Carbondale, noted the money will allow the company to implement automation to improve its efficiency and increase capacity.

"We're changing, transforming and modernizing but this would take us 10 years," Stallings said. "Now, in one or two years, we're going to significantly modernize the plant which is really good news for the employees. We're going to raise their skills and hire more people. This is another major transformation for us because we're preparing for the next decades of helmets going out."

NEPIRC's 2023 Manufacturing Day Best Practices Summit & Expo a Grand Celebration

NEPIRC's 2023 Manufacturing Best Practices Summit and Expo, the region's largest manufacturing trade show and networking event, was held on October 13 at Mohegan Pennsylvania Convention Center in Wilkes-Barre Twp. The event provided an opportunity for manufacturers from an 11-county region to join together to learn, listen, share, collaborate and forge new partnerships with other manufacturers.

More than 100 manufacturers exhibited their products from robotics to safety apparel and equipment, to packaging, to printing and cybersecurity systems. This year's expo was the largest in the event's history, with nearly 600 registered attendees networking at the expo and attending the variety of educational breakout sessions held during the day. In addition, more than 70 high school students attended the expo to learn about careers in manufacturing.



Highlights of the expo included a keynote speech from Crayola COO Pete Ruggiero who shared his experiences leading Crayola through the last 26 years, including the supply chain challenges the company encountered during the Covid-19 pandemic. His keynote, Thriving Amidst Supply Chain Chaos, provided key insights to attendees on how Crayola diversified its business model through new product development, expanded further into international markets and integrated Lean and Six Sigma into their operating processes.

Representative Matt Cartwright and Representative Dan Meuser, who were originally scheduled to address the attendees in person, sent pre-recorded video messages to welcome attendees to the event.

One of the breakout sessions focused on the growing sector of women in manufacturing leadership roles. Dr. Christine Kiesinger, principal, CEK Communication Consultancy, served as moderator for the Women Leaders in Manufacturing panel discussion that included women leaders from manufacturers across the commonwealth, including Denise Truesdale, Pride Mobility Products Corp., Duryea; Pat Frances, Chaucer Press, Wilkes-Barre; Grace McGregor Kramer, McGregor Industries, Dunmore, Heidi McKenna, The Fredericks Company, Huntington Valley and Petra Mitchell, Catalyst Connection, Pittsburgh.

- Cold Forged Automotive Ball & Socket Parts (6) First-tier automotive supplier in Maine seeking cold forger to produce six different automotive ball and socket parts. The prior supplier is no longer available to produce these important parts. The new provider must be ISO 9001 certified. NEPIRC has all technical specifications and drawings for these parts, which range in order quantity from a lot ow 34,900/month to high of 143,500/month. Most parts require cold forging, quench and temper with shot cleaning and 100% crack/flaw inspection by Magnetic Partial Inspection or similar. Most items have a Zinc Phosphate coating and some have a Rust Pretension treatment. Material grade is s46 (SAE 1049), S15 (SAE 1015), SB25 (SAE 15B25) or SCM40 (SAE 4140). - Cut & Bent Aluminum Sheet Metal West Coast company looking for supplier to
 cut and bend aluminum sheet metal using laser cutter and CNC press brake. A
 provider who can also do laser tube cutting is preferred. Work will be done on 5052
 and 6061 aluminum with tight tolerances. Some deburring and sanding may also be

- Plastic Extruder for Fencing Components Start-up business seeking manufacturing partner to fabricate rectangular PVC extrusion pieces with tongue-and-groove profiles and internal ribs for reinforcement. Product will be used for fencing. The product will use plant-based plastics and have earth tone finish. Item will be sold as an accessory to the company's existing aluminum fence and post systems. Generally, pieces are 1.5" wide x 6" high x 94" long with a .5" tongue/groove on opposite sides. Items have a .125" edge radius, .080-.100 wall thickness and 4-5 internal ribs. Annual purchase expected to be 180,000 lbs. spread over 6 truckloads of approximately 30,000 lbs. each.
